Statistical analysis helps identify patterns and correlations that may indicate underlying challenges in the preparatory process. To supplement the quantitative analysis, I will conduct interviews and surveys to gather in-depth perspectives from stakeholders involved in PISA preparation. Through qualitative data, I aim to uncover nuanced challenges and provide context to quantitative findings.

This research will contribute to a better understanding of PISA and the problems and solutions associated with its preparatory processes in Uzbekistan. The findings of the study will be of interest to policymakers, educators, and researchers concerned with improving student achievement within Uzbekistan's education system.
